Doctor of Ministry Financial Assistance

Entrance to the Program

An employee sponsored by the Illinois Conference to study for the Doctor of Ministry degree at Andrews University shall:

- 1. Be an ordained minister of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.
- 2. Have a Master of Divinity or Bachelor of Divinity degree or equivalent (as required by the Seminary).
- 3. Have made commendable progress in past ministry and demonstrated capacity for filling unique pastoral assignments.
- 4. Have served as an employee of the Illinois Conference for a minimum of two years.
- 5. Have served a minimum of four years in pastoral ministry.
- 6. Have no other doctoral degree and not be near completion of a doctoral degree in some other discipline.
- 7. Receive approval from ADCOM.
- 8. Only three (3) pastors can be in the assistance program at the same time.

Distribution of Costs*

- 1. The student will utilize all accumulated Continuing Education Funds first.
- 2. The student will be responsible for the cost of textbooks.
- 3. The Conference pays one-third of all tuition costs.
- 4. The Conference pays up to half for all travel costs (airfare, hotel, car rental).
- 5. The student will not be charged vacation time or out-of-conference trip time while attending classes.
- 6. The above coverage assumes a 2-year amortization prior to the student's accepting a call to another field or organization.

Application

- 1. The employee will submit a 400-word summary stating the following:
 - a. The purpose for entering the program The why?
 - b. How will the education program enhance your ministry now?
 - c. Since the program is a 4-6 year process, what will be the anticipated benefits to you and your district after you have completed the program?
- 2. The application will be submitted to the Ministerial Director.
- 3. Once approved by the Ministerial Director, will be passed on to the Executive Secretary.
- 4. Final ADCOM decision will be communicated to the Ministerial Director.

Under special circumstances, when an academic program at the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary does not fit for an individual or the DMin program does not offer adequate classwork in a specific ministry, students may receive up to these amounts at other seminaries. This will occur only when the student obtains prior approval for his or her course of study.
